

Year 4 Half Term 1 Topic: The Romans

This half term we will be learning the following things. Here are also some useful hints and tips for helping at home!

	At School	At Home
English	In English, Year 4 pupils will be encouraged to learn and write through fiction texts including; A River, Red and Dog. We will explore writing our own version of a familiar narrative and focus particularly on character description. During this half term, we will also be looking at fiction and nonfiction texts to build more confidence in answering a range of retrieval questions. This means children will use the text to find factual information to answer the question and developing their skills to skim and scan the text.	 Aim to hear your child read at least four times a week. Read your child a book on a night. Promote a love of reading. Encourage your child to seize as many writing opportunities as possible.
Maths	In Maths, the class will start by extending their knowledge of place value by identifying the value of digits of numbers up to 10,000, counting forwards and backwards from any given number within 10,000, reading and writing numbers in words and digits within 1000 and comparing and ordering numbers using symbols. The children are expected to read and write Roman Numerals up to the value of 100.	 Continue to revise 1, 2, 5, 8, 10 times tables. Count in 25s.
Science	In Science, pupils will be investigating the topic 'Animals Including Humans' and Jill Robinson the famous animal activist. Specifically, we will be learning how the body digests food, the names and functions of types of teeth and how living things are positioned in a food chain.	 Talk about the different types of teeth and their functions Talk about oral hygiene. How do we keep our mouth healthy?
History	In History, Year 3 will be learning about the three phases of The Romans. We will learn about the Roman invasion of Britain and the building of Hadrian's Wall. We will be visiting Binchester Roman Fort later in the term.	Talk at home about the Romans. Can they retell any facts?
Geography	In Geography this half term, pupils will be exploring rivers. The children will learn where water comes from and the features of a river from source to mouth.	Discuss at home rivers you have seen or visited.
Art	In Art, pupils will look at drawing. We will consider a variety of drawing techniques to create art work based around shading, expression and from different perspectives, using scaling to help proportion drawings. We will use a variety of tools including pencils of different grades, charcoal, biro ink, chalk pastels and oil pastels.	 Look at different art work created by drawing Discuss our 3 artists – Christopher Wren, Henry Moore and Jackson Pollock

PE, we will be focusing on football and lacrosse. The class will participate in a range of fun, active, engaging lessons concentrating on a specific skill each lesson. We will be aiming to develop the fundamental skills from each lesson. In RE, pupils will be answering the learning question "Why is Jesus inspiring to some people?" The children will study the events of Holy Week and explore parables to consider the importance of Jesus in some people's lives. Whilst doing so, children will be encouraged to reflect on their own role models, expressing their opinions on religion and faith. In Year 4, Children will continue to learn Latin as their foreign language. This term, children will be an access the internet all over the world. Children will learn about computing systems and networks. They will learn about the internet, how it works and how we are able to access the internet all over the world. Children in Year 4 will learn how they can access lact lessons, children will be made aware of the rules they need to follow to remain safe while using the internet. The children will have online safety lessons to teach them how to be safe online and what to do if something makes them feel unsafe. Publication of People who help me'.
