Q1 My child is happy at Cambrai Primary School.



Q2 My child feels safe at Cambrai Primary School

Your suggestion...	Our Response...
Can my child go through the whole of school in the portakabin – I just love how amazing you have made it! (I have every faith that the new school will be amazing!)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 👩🏫 Sadly not – but we know that you will LOVE the new building... 👩🏫 The classroom will feel similar as all of the furniture / resources will go with us! 👩🏫 We are so happy that you love our temporary school this much – thank you! We think this wasn't a real 'suggestion' – but a lovey compliment – thank you. 😊
Will we get to look around the new building with the children before they go over? When is it due to be finished?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 👩🏫 We are hoping so. The building doesn't become 'ours' until the official handover, so it will be a request that we will make, but we can't guarantee. 👩🏫 The children will have more involvement over the coming weeks – we aim to build a time capsule and visit the site as part of the building contractor's commitment to community working 👩🏫 The last possible date that the school can be handed over is the end of the Spring Term, so we will be in for after Easter at the latest. A slight delay on the original date given to us, but as we are so happy in our temporary school, we can wait for perfection!
I wonder if the lunch menu could be reviewed?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 👩🏫 Mrs Lambert is currently doing this for after half term. She's made notes every day about what the children have enjoyed – and not enjoyed so much – so a new menu will be out next week.
Second food option – maybe a cold option (sandwiches etc) along with the hot meal?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 👩🏫 We will always check if a child doesn't eat much of their dinner, and will make toast and offer additional yoghurts and fruit if needed. Reception is a year when children try so many new foods, so we really try and persevere over the year as lots of children will say they don't like things, but once they've tried them, actually do! We have already had so much success with this! That said, if at the end of the year this is still an issue, we will look at this request again for year 1, when we have more children on site.

Service Family Premium:

Service families were asked what they felt would be a useful spend of the £300 Service Families Premium. Their responses are:

Service Pupil Premium

The Department for Education introduced the Service Pupil Premium (SPP) in April 2011 in recognition of the specific challenges children from service families face and as part of the commitment to delivering the armed forces covenant. It is designed to assist the school in providing the additional support that these children may need and is currently worth £300 per service child who meets the eligibility criteria. Eligible schools receive the SPP so that they can offer mainly pastoral support during challenging times and to help mitigate the negative impact on service children of family mobility or parental deployment.

SPP should not be used to subsidise routine school activity (trips, music lessons etc.)

Schools are held to account for the spending of this funding through the focus in Ofsted inspections on the progress and attainment of their wider Pupil Premium eligible pupil cohort.

From this review, we will now set about creating a strategy to spend the SPP, however, we cannot use the SPP to pay for trips and pupil milk, according to DFE rules. We can, however, accommodate all other requests within the plan.
