

Our new topic in Reception is 'The Chinese New Year'. Here are some ways you can help support your child's learning at home:-



It's The Year of the rabbit!



Communication and Language

- We will be reading stories about the Chinese New Year and the animals in the Chinese zodiac - Dragons, Rabbits, Snakes, tigers ..
- We will be singing Chinese themed songs, 5 green dragons, Two Tigers (in Mandarin)
- Talk to your child about what they have discovered during their time at school, letting your child recount their experiences with all their family.

Maths

- We will be looking at the animals of the Chinese Zodiac and using positional language to order them in the race 1st, 2nd, 3rd ... 12th
- We will be counting forwards and backwards to 20 every day and finding +1 -1
- We will continue learning about the composition of numbers to 10 - how many ways can you make each number? For example $6 = 5+1, 4+2, 3+3$...
- We will continue to practise forming numbers accurately

Understanding the World

- We will be discussing what animal your child was born in according to the Chinese New Year calendar - Ox, Tiger, rabbit, dragon, snake... Find out the years for different members of your family and talk to your child about this.
- It is traditional in China to clean the house on New Year's Eve - to clean away any badness from the previous year - let your child help you clean the house - we will be cleaning our class room!
- We are going to taste some Chinese food and discuss likes and dislikes. If you get a Chinese meal ask your child to talk about it!
- We will look at maps and globes to locate China.

Physical Development

- We will be using the big bricks to make a real life construction - The Great Wall of China - look at some pictures on the computer at home
- We will be using pencils, crayons and scissors to draw, colour and cut out pictures, including the different animals of Chinese New Year.
- We will continue to try hard to hold and use scissors effectively - encourage your child to cut things out at home - cut forwards.

Expressive Arts and Design

- The children will be colouring in dragons, rabbits and the animal of the year they were born in.
- It is the year of the rabbit - we are going to be making rabbit puppets and having puppet shows with the animals.
- We will be playing in our Chinese restaurant and adding food to the menu.

Things to Remember:

Bring your reading book every day and don't forget to practise reading at home. Learn to read the tricky words as whole words. Sound book two is in the phonic folder.
