There's no experience necessary and all instruments for lessons are provided. Children learn up to 300 instrument, band, and performance skills, whilst playing songs they love. Children can achieve an Ofqual-regulated Music qualification, accredited by Trinity College London, without having to take a single exam. Places are offered on a first come, first served basis.
